The number of people contacting AA is growing. The Online Response Team is recruiting responders on an on-going basis. The online responder is the first contact for those seeking Alcoholics Anonymous via the website, so to do this responsible job needs a person with a minimum of two years sobriety plus a good working knowledge of the Traditions. Experience as a telephone responder would be an asset but is not a prerequisite. Application forms are available from the website or from GSO.

Qualifications for service: Online Response Service (Responder) No limit on numbers applying Minimum 2 years sobriety and a thorough understanding of the programme, the traditions and the guidelines. Experience of service within AA. (Access via a mobile device is not suitable for this role.) Computer competent i.e. familiar with the use of email and the Internet. Good communication skills, able to write clear, concise, simple and literate English. Access to an online computer during the shift, without hindrance from work, or other, commitments.

If you've got at least a year's continuous sobriety and want to do Telephone Service, the training session is held on the first Monday of every month at 7.15 for a 7.30pm start, at the AA Telephone Service Office.
